 - There is a real desire to expand the school's offerings, particularly for the younger children. Could the PA help with funding a small pilot program next year? This would likely involve a few after-school clubs led by teachers who'd like to do this (hopefully with support from high-school students)
 - Start with lower grades, do a pilot run of some after school clubs
 - Angie said there may be a late bus for the tutoring program this might be an opportunity to provide buses for after school clubs too
 - Alisha said to plan for \$100k needed to run the program because you'd need to provide a bus in order to make it equitable

Soft lockdowns at High School – what is the protocol for communicating to parents?

• Per Alisha, a soft lockdown means there is an incident at school which requires student privacy. Everyone is safe but must stay in place. Every time a soft lockdown is done, it is preparation for a real lockdown. Staff is very comfortable with the protocols. Every year Norwell police works with teachers in August to run through protocol. It's done every year because best practices and protocols change. Front door and back door protocols are checked daily. Teachers have protocols for where to sit, look, and where to be positioned in playground.
